SafeCare® Colorado Referral Protocol

SafeCare® is a voluntary home visiting program for families with 1 or more children between 0-5 years. Families must meet specific criteria to be eligible for services.

Referral sources are asked to use the exact script below when referring families.

A referral to SafeCare does not replace the need to make a mandated report to child welfare if child abuse or neglect is suspected.

What is SafeCare®?

SafeCare® is a structured, evidence-based, in-home program that provides direct skill training to parents in the areas of parenting, child safety, and child health. In Colorado, SafeCare® is being provided as a voluntary program for families who do not have an open child welfare case. The program targets families with children ages zero to five years. SafeCare® typically takes 18-20 sessions to complete (about 4-6 months) and each session lasts 1-1.5 hours. SafeCare® is delivered in the home by trained staff.

What type of families would benefit from SafeCare®?

 Families with 1 or more children between 0-5 years, who need extra support managing child behavior, keeping their home free of safety hazards, or taking care of their child's basic health care needs.

What will families learn?

- **Health Module** –Home visitors teach parents to use health guides, identify and prevent common child illnesses and injuries, and decide when to treat at home, call the doctor, or visit the emergency room.
- **Home Safety Module** –Home visitors teach parents to identify and eliminate safety and health hazards and childproof the home.
- **Parenting Module** –Home visitors teach parents to provide engaging and stimulating activities, increase positive interactions, and prevent challenging child behavior.

SafeCare® in Colorado

A review of Colorado's substantiated child abuse reports shows that young children under age five are at the greatest risk for being subjected to child abuse or neglect. Over the past 34 years more than 60 studies have been conducted to develop and validate SafeCare®. Home hazards were reduced by 78% after SafeCare®, and there was an 84% increase in the use of positive parenting skills (Gershater-Molko, Lutzker, & Wesch, 2003). As a result SafeCare® has been designated as an evidence-based program for parenting.

Over the next three years, SafeCare® will be implemented in counties throughout Colorado. During this time, continuous quality improvement will be conducted to learn more about Colorado's unique culture and the need for SafeCare® in Colorado communities. In year one, SafeCare® Colorado will be implemented in Denver County and Jefferson County in partnership with Savio House; Mesa County in partnership with Mesa County Department of Public Health; La Plata, Montezuma, Dolores and San Juan counties, the Southern Ute Tribe and Ute Mountain Ute Tribe in partnership with the Montezuma County Public Health Department; and Cheyenne, Kit Carson, Yuma, Sedgwick, Logan, Washington, Lincoln, Elbert, Morgan and Phillips counties in partnership with Baby Bear Hugs.
